## "Me, Myself and I"

There seems to be a time when most people can think only of themselves. It seems there is the thought of what do I want? What is it that will entertain me and what is it that will make me feel I am getting the most out of life? Then one day the light seems to come on. There is more to life than I am getting and I need to explore this possibility. **There is more to life than "Me, Myself, and I."** 

Could it be there is a God? The Bible tells us everything came into existence by an act of creation, Gen. 1:1-2. "1 In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. 2 And the earth was waste and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep: and the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters." The six days of creation are specified in Gen.1 and all that was created therein. After creation we are told by David, Psa. 19, "1 The heavens declare the glory of God; And the firmament showeth his handiwork. 2 Day unto day utterereth speech, and night unto night showeth knowledge. 3 There is no speech nor language; Their voice is not heard. 4 Their line is gone out through all the earth, and their words to the end of the world. In them hath he set a tabernacle for the sun, 5 Which is as a bridegroom coming out of his chamber, And rejoiceth as a strong man to run his course. 6 His going forth is from the end of the heavens, And his circuit unto the ends of it: And there is nothing hid from the heat thereof," Psa. 19:1-6. In the New Testament we learn Jesus was the creator, Jno. 1:1-3, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 The same was in the beginning with God 3 All things were made through him; and without him was not anything made that hath been made." The Word in these verses is Jesus that became flesh, Jno. 1:14 "And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us (and we beheld his glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father), full of grace and truth." In Heb. 1:2, "2 ..... through whom also he made the worlds." Also, Col. 1:16. In the beginning there was God, Gen. 1:1; there was the Spirit, Gen. 1:2; and according to the New Testament, Jesus the creator of all things was there. Father, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit were there in the beginning. Now I know there is something more than "Me, Myself, and I." God is to be first in my life, Matt. 22:37: "

Since Jesus is our creator, he is God, Jno. 1:1, we need to honor him as being our creator. "20 Nay but, O man, who art thou hart repliest against God? Shall the thing formed say to him that formed it, Why didst thou make me thus?" Rom. 9:20. Matt. 22:36-37, "36 Teacher, which is he great commandment in the law? 37 And he said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all they mind." The word presents ourselves as being a "living sacrifice unto God," Rom. 12:1. Consider also, Matt, 10:38-39, "38 And he that doth not take his cross and follow after me, is no worthy of me. 39 He that findeth his life shall lose it; and he that loseth his life for my sake shall find it." Now, we have come to the point of recognizing there is someone greater than "Me, Myself, and I!" I need to "yield," "submit," and "humble" Me, Myself, and I, to my "potter."

We shall never be satisfied until we know we have complied with the expectation of God – We are informed in his book delivered to us. Jesus said, "28 Come unto me, II ye that labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. 29 Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. 30 For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." Matt. 11:28-30.

The thought of God being first in my life, takes away the idea of "Me, Myself, and I." It is no longer "Me, Myself, and I living; but, God that lives through me. I must come to realize it is God first and not Myself. Just look at the "I's" in Lk. 12:16-21.

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
