## "OLD TESTAMENT --- NEW TESTAMENT"

Continued from last week: Col. 2:13-15, also teaches we are no longer under the Law of Moses, but are under the Law of Christ: "13 And you, being dead through your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, you I say, did he make alive together with him, having forgiven us all our trespasses; 14 having blotted out the bond written in ordinances that was against us, which was contrary to us: and he hath taken it out of the way, nailing it to the cross; 15 having despoiled the principalities and the powers, he made a show of them openly, triumphing over them in it." In this statement, you want to get a hold on, "nailing it to the cross." The Law of Moses was "nailed to the cross" and is no longer in existence.

This is the reason for Paul stating in Col. 2:16-17, "16 Let no man therefore judge you in meat, or in drink, or in respect of a feast day or a new moon or a Sabbath day: 17 which are a shadow of the things to come; but the body is Christ's." The expressions, "meat," "drink," "feast day," "new moon," "or a Sabbath day," shows Paul is talking about the Law of Moses and that they should not be a part of it, that is the Law of Moses, because it has "been nailed to the cross." The Law of Moses has been "nailed to the cross." The Law off Moses is no longer in existence!

The Law of Moses was "against us and contrary to us." The reason this is so, is because the blood of animals, bulls and goats could **not** take away the sins of the world, Heb. 10:4. The Law of Moses was, "added because of transgressions, till the seed should come to whom the promise hath been made; and it was ordained through angels by the hand of a mediator," Gal. 3:19. The Law of Moses was not intended to be a **permanent Law.** Paul declares, "It was added because of transgressions, till the seed should come," Gal.3:19; and that it was to be, "till the seed should come," – that was **till the coming of Christ**. Gal. 5:4 is a strong passage stating, "Ye are severed from Christ, ye who would be justified by the law; ye are fallen away from grace." Should one determine he was going to adhere to the Law of Moses, "he is fallen away from grace," (not in association with God), Gal. 5:4. You cannot adhere to the Law of Moses and the Law of Christ at the same time.

This is a point I make with the Sabbatarians, under the Law of Christ; they **cannot adhere** to the Law of Moses and the Sabbath Day, the Seventh Day. The "**Seventh Day Advantest**" doing so are keeping the Law of Moses and causes one to fall from Grace, (if he/she are in grace), Gal. 5:4. "*That which was against us and contrary to us*," was "nailed to the cross," and we are no longer under that law! The same argument was made with the "**World Radio Church of God**," which was brought into existence by Herbert W. Armstrong. Both of these groups are "Sabbaterians" and are causing people to practice a Law that has been "nailed to the cross."

The Law of Christ was first taught on the day of Pentecost, in 33 A.D., by the Apostles. After it was preached it then is referred to as the "Apostles Doctrine," Acts 2:42. This is the day the New Law was introduced, preached, and obeyed. Three thousand people listened and responded to the newly preached Gospel, Acts 2:41. Those that were baptized were the ones who received the remission of their sins, Acts 2:38 and these were the ones that were added to the church, by the Lord: "And the Lord added to the church daily such as should be saved," Acts 2:47 (KJV).
