WHAT IS NOT FAITH

(Rom. 10:17)

"17 So then faith cometh by hearing and hearing by the word of God," Rom. 10:17. This passage clearly establishes the fact of "faith cometh by hearing," Rom. 10:17. If something is of faith, it can be seen written in the New Testament; thus, what is not written cannot be of faith. For the sake of illustrating I want to turn this around and observe another thought that is **demanded.**

If something is of faith, when it can be cited in the New Testament – "faith comes from hearing and hearing from the word of God," then that which cannot be read in the New Testament cannot produce faith! This being true, there are many who think they have faith, that really do not have the Bible Faith, the Lord requires. Consider some of these consequences.

DENOMINATIONALISM cannot be a matter of faith. The **Baptist** Church, **Methodist** Church, **Pentecostal** Church, **Lutheran** Church, Presbyterian Church, **Shepherd of the Hills** Church, **Mormon** Church, **Jehovah Witness** Church, and yes, even though the **Catholic** Church is not a denomination we shall include it. These, just to name a few, and the naming of these representing **all religious organizations** (churches) which cannot be read of in the word of God - **cannot be of faith!** You could belong to any of these organizations and none of them be of faith; because, one cannot read of them in the New Testament. If you cannot read of such in the New Testament, it cannot be of faith, Rom. 10:17. I was presented with the thought, many years ago, "You cannot find the Church of Christ in the Bible?" To which I responded, "Yes you can, Rom. 16:16," "The churches of Christ salute you." This is the church the Lord built; and thus, is called after his name. The Lord's building of his church can be read of in the New Testament, Matt. 16:18; and thus, **is of faith.**

BAPTISM is taught by the Baptist Church. The Baptist Church does not teach baptism to be saved; but rather: "It is the door into the Baptist Church." Also they define baptism as: "An outward sign of an inward conversion." According to them, this is baptism. Baptism, according to them, is for the purpose of showing to the world they are saved – this salvation took place before baptism. Now, where in the New Testament do you read of such? It cannot be found. Baptist baptism cannot be found in the New Testament; thus, is not of faith. What the Baptist teaches about baptism is not found in the New Testament; thus, their practice is not of faith!

THE MORMON CHURCH teaches we need an addition to the Bible, the book of Mormon. The Bible says, "16 Every scripture inspired of God is also profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for instruction which is in righteousness: 17 that the man of God may be complete, furnished completely unto every good work," II Tim. 3:16-17. According to this, **the book of Mormon is not needed**, God's word is **complete** without it. Add to this Jude 3, "3 I was constrained to write unto you exhorting you to contend earnestly for the faith which was once for all delivered unto the saints." The book of Mormon **cannot be of faith**; because, one cannot read of it from the Bible, Rom. 10"17.

There are millions who claim faith and yet, what they believe **cannot** be found in the New Testament. If It cannot be found in the New Testament **it cannot** be **the faith of the Bible** – Rom. 10:17, "Faith cometh of hearing and hearing by the word of God." If it cannot be heard, it cannot be the faith of the Bible. Could it be that there are thousands who claim to have faith; yet, what they have is not the faith of the Bible?
